

Home Game Concession Volunteers

-Set Up/Break Down Crew

Set-up starts at 4:00 and is completed before the game begins. Duties include: setting up tents; placing tables in the grill area and main concession stand; bringing out extension cords; setting up grill and funnel cake burners (if used); putting ice and drinks into Coke carts, and taking Coke carts and food to home/visitor concession stands. Break down occurs after the game and is the reverse of set-up.

-Main Concession Stand

- 1.) Window Worker - Take the orders and handle the money.
- 2.) Gopher - Get the food/drink and give it to the window worker.

Workers should arrive at 6:15. You will be done at the end of the game. The main concession stand is in the east end zone.

-Home/Visitor Concession Stands

Workers should arrive at 6:15; clean and close the stand at the beginning of the 4th quarter. A limited menu is offered at these stands.

-Floater

Floater should arrive by 6:15 and check in at the main concession stand to see where extra help is needed. You should be finished by the end of the 3rd quarter, but may be relieved earlier if not needed.

-Grill Cooker

Grill Cookers should arrive by 5:30, and will be done by the end of the 3rd quarter. Cookers will prepare hot dogs and hamburgers on the grill provided. The cooking tent is located adjacent to the main concession stand.

-Food Wrapper

Food Wrappers should arrive by 5:30 and will be done by the end of the 3rd quarter. Wrappers package hot dogs and hamburgers and deliver them to the main concession stand.

-50/50 Raffle

Workers should arrive by 6:15 and work until just before half-time. Sell 50/50 raffle tickets at the gate and in the stands. Just before the half, count money and take tickets to the press box where announcer will assist in choosing the winner. Leave half of the money in press box, and return remainder of the tickets and money to the main concession stand. The money will be included with the night's receipts.

-Main Concession Stand Clean-up Crew

Workers arrive after the game ends. Duties include: mopping floor, cleaning counters, washing dishes and taking out the trash.

Home Game Stadium Volunteers

-Band Sitter

Duties include: filling the cooler with water and ice at the main concession stand and taking it and cups to the band section in the stands; distributing plumes to the band prior to half-time, and sitting in the band block at half-time and during the 3rd quarter for security purposes.

-Pit Crew

Prior to the half-time performance, pit crew members will assist students in placing and setting up large equipment on the field. After performance pit crew aids the students in breaking down the large field equipment and returns it to the trailer. **PLEASE NOTE:** pit crew members must be able to lift and carry heavy instruments, cases, and equipment.

-Videographer

Record the half-time performance on a video camera provided by the band. **Note:** for home games the video perch is located on top of the press box.

-Van/Trailer Driver

Arrive by 5:45 to hitch the instrument trailer to the band's van and drive it to Titan Stadium. Drive the van back to the band room at the end of the game.

Away Game, Exhibition or Competition Volunteers

Volunteers will assist students in loading and unloading instruments from the trailer and van at away games, exhibitions and competitions.

-Away Game, Exhibition or Competition Chaperone

Meet at the school at the designated time, ride the buses with the students to and from all events, and sit near the band at the game, festival or competition. Chaperones will be assigned jobs to include: filling water cooler and distributing water; transporting first-aid kit to and from trailer; sitting in the band block, working as pit crew, and other jobs as needed (see home game volunteer job descriptions). While riding the bus, chaperones should position themselves throughout the bus.

-Videographer

Record the half-time performance on a video camera provided by the band. You may ride the bus or travel separately.

-Van/Trailer Driver

Arrive at the designated time to hitch the instrument trailer to the band's van and drive it to the away game's destination, exhibition or competition. The arrival time may vary depending on location of away game or exhibition/competition. Drive the van back to the band room at the end of the game, exhibition or competition. The van and trailer travel with the buses to and from all events.
